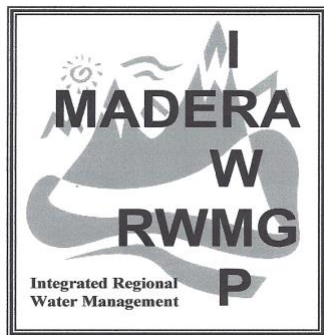

- The 2025 Wildfire & Forest Resilience Directed Grant Program is currently accepting applications through 5 pm on January 31, 2026. The primary focus of this program is protecting people and communities. [California's Wildfire and Forest Resilience Action Plan: A Comprehensive Strategy](#) identifies three goals that are strongly aligned with Sierra Nevada Conservancy's (SNC) Watershed Improvement Plan: healthy and resilient natural places, safe communities, and sustainable economies. This program aims to support projects that result in a combination of multiple watershed, ecosystem, and community benefits.

- DWR recently released the [Spring 2025 Semi-Annual Groundwater Conditions Update](#). Made up of groundwater data gathered over the past year from various DWR tools and annual reports from local GSAs, the Update includes information on statewide groundwater levels, groundwater storage, recharge, land subsidence, well infrastructure and the status of California's groundwater conditions. The Update also summarizes groundwater conditions in the first five years of SGMA implementation since GSAs submitted their initial GSPs.
- [CAL FIRE'S Wildfire Prevention Grants Program](#) is currently accepting applications through 3 pm on August 6th. This program provides funding for fire prevention projects and activities in and near fire threatened communities. Funded activities include hazardous fuels reduction, wildfire prevention planning, and wildfire prevention education with an emphasis on improving public health and safety while reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
